# **MINUTES**

Minutes of the Annual Assembly Meeting of Seal Parish Council held on Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2025 at 7.30 pm, at Seal Memorial Pavilion, Seal Recreation Ground, High Street, Seal TN15 0AF.

- 1. The Chairman opened the meeting and welcomed all attendees.
- 2. Apologies for absence received from:

- 3. The minutes of the previous Annual Parish Meeting were signed by the Chairman.
- 4. Chairman's Report- The Chairman's report will be circulated and appended to the minutes.
- **5. Planning- Chris Haslam- Planning Chairman-** To be circulated separately. Thanks were extended to Cllr Stiasny for her diligence in overseeing planning matters.
- 6. Finance- Andrew Michaelides, Finance Chairman Accounts will be circulated at the meeting
  - Cllr Michaelides, Chair of the Finance Committee, presented the finance report and thanked Cllr Stiasny for her support.
  - The main source of income remains the precept (a share of council tax). The precept was increased by 2.8% for 2024/25.

- Additional income comes from hiring out the field to the football club and leasing the old fire station to the dentist.
- Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) income was received and is restricted to improvements within the parish for public benefit.
- In 2024/25, the council opened a CCLA investment account, which is expected to yield approximately £10,000 annually.
- Expenditure primarily includes staffing (Parish Clerk and part-time caretaker), Pavilion maintenance, and grounds upkeep.
- A surplus of £50,000 was reported for the year, increasing reserves to £350,000. These reserves may be used to support infrastructure such as roads.

#### 7. Introduction of New County Councillor- Marc Logen

- Cllr Logen introduced himself and expressed his desire to remain updated on local matters. He is currently undergoing onboarding as a new KCC councillor.
- A resident raised concern about the absence of cabinet representation from West Kent (Tonbridge, Tunbridge Wells, Sevenoaks).
- Cllr Logan, who holds a full-time tech role and oversees 10 parishes, explained that committee roles take ~40 hours/week and cabinet roles up to 60.
- He emphasised improving resident engagement, particularly via social media and surveys.
- He welcomed ideas on how to make West Kent's voice heard and acknowledged the East/West Kent divide raised by Cllr Thornton.
- Road issues should continue to be reported to Kent Highways.
- Questions were raised about the legitimacy of emergency roadworks, especially those relating to Southeastern Water.

# District Councillor Report- Julia

- Resident query regarding local government reorganisation.
- Julia confirmed Kent and Medway are not in the fast-track devolution wave.

- KCC elections have concluded. From SDC's side, any reorganisation is unlikely before May 2028.
- Noted that some SDC colleagues have left the Conservative group and now sit as West Kent Independents.
- There are discussions about transferring assets.
- Budget: A 10-year financial plan has been delivered.
- Changes to waste: black and reusable sacks withdrawn. Government is pushing for a separate weekly food waste collection, with alternating black bin and recycling collection.
- Sevenoaks currently does not separate food waste weekly; this may change.
- Julia is no longer overseeing the Local Plan.
- A resident asked why granted planning permissions are not always actioned— Compulsory Purchase Orders were briefly discussed.

### 8. Tarmac and Scouts Development Update

- Joseph (main contact for SPC and STC) provided an update.
- A steering group exists comprising the Scouts, KCC, and Parish Councils.
- The Oast House project (within Town Council boundaries) has been approved; work to be completed by August.
- S106 agreement has been signed, and the development is moving to the reserved matters stage.
- The Sevenoaks Scouts are working with Tarmac to develop the East Side for use by all 11 Scout groups in the district and the wider community.
- So far, £500,000 has been raised, with a final target of £1–1.5 million.
